The European continent has been shaped by war over and over again for centuries. Even after the catastrophe of World War II, Europe was far from united, the period up to 1990 was called the Cold War. The KSZE, later transformed into OSCE, has played an important role to prevent many conflicts between East and West from escalating into major conflicts. After the end of the Cold War in the early 1990s, Europeans hoped for an extended period of peace. But 30-years later, security in Europe seems to have become more fragile. What are the reasons?
